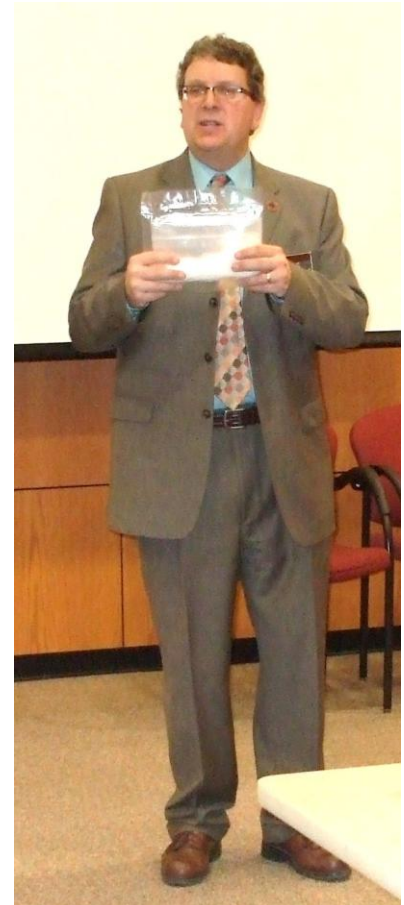

In a letter addressed to January 26 General Meeting attendees Captain Charles Wood, Waukesha County Commander METRO Drug Unit, wrote the following setting the stage for his presentation. "Waukesha County has bucked some national trends when it comes to drug abuse. We have very little methamphetamine; however, we are in the center crosshairs for synthetic opiates and heroin. The drugs we seize, reported drug overdoses, number of needles distributed and a rise in numbers of people seeking addiction treatment support this." He went on to say, "while focusing on the threat from heroin and synthetic opiates, we still must deal with ready availability of marijuana, cocaine and other less common controlled substances."

Speaking to a nearly packed house of NBPCAAA members, Captain Wood regaled his audience with a package of interesting case histories, facts on a multitude of drugs and valuable information on drug enforcement activities in Waukesha County. Included in his lively and entertaining discourse were disturbing statistics on the extent of controlled substance availability in our county. To further the listener's knowledge, Captain Wood provided hands on experience with numerous samples of drugs and illegal substances, with the admonishment, "only look", you can't take them with you." In summary, a very interesting and informative experience for a most appreciative audience.

MEMBERS CELEBRATE THE BEGINNING OF YEAR 2 FOR NBPCAAA

The January 26 membership meeting was kicked off with committee reports on 2011 results and plans for 2012. This past year saw NBPCAAA grow from its infancy to be a well-grounded organization dedicated to community service and support of our police department.

Jerry Vogel, NBPCAAA Treasurer, reported we have over \$2,000 in our checking account. Kim Adey, the Membership Committee Chairperson, encouraged members to consider joining the membership committee, which plays a key role in growing our association. She also spoke of the need to attain advertising display boards for events such as Safety Saturday, scheduled for May 19.

Hope Hegmen, Special Events Committee Chairperson, detailed a number of upcoming events that included MILO IES Simulator Shoot/Don't Shoot on February 13, a Crime Lab field trip in March and a proposed NBPCAAA picnic in June. She also passed along the gratitude expressed by our police officers for the dinners provided this past Christmas weekend.

Barb Koutnik, Fundraising Committee Chairperson recalled our fund raising efforts, summarizing past and proposed activities. Central to her report were the financial outcome of both the Buy Seasons experience and flower bulb promotion. Please watch for additional fundraising opportunities in the coming weeks.

Karen Engeldinger, Communications Committee Chairperson has been busy masterminding NBPCAAA's electronic links to members and the general public. She has developed an arsenal that includes our web site, LinkedIn, Facebook, NBPCAAA newsletter and various announcements, flyers, templates. These various communication modalities play a vital roles in keeping members informed putting a face on our organization, its purpose and achievements.

Operation Recovery

What is Operation Recovery?

Operation Recovery is a program that recommends and promotes recording information about your property to aid our police department with the return of your property if items are ever stolen.

What is the role of the Police Department in property recovery?

Information about stolen property with serial numbers is entered into both a state Law Enforcement Data System and a national computer database known as the National Crime Information Center (NCIC).

This information is available to federal, state and local police agencies 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

When an item is found it can be “checked for stolen” through NCIC to determine if it matches any items listed in the database.

What can I do?

A few minutes of your time can go a long way to assist everyone in the recovery of property. You only need to record descriptions of your property on the Operation Recovery Inventory Record form (See newsletter insert) and keep it in a safe place. The [Operation Recovery Information sheet](#) and the [Operation Recovery Log Form](#) can also be downloaded and printed from the [New Berlin Police Department Community Programs](#) website. We recommend that you make two copies, one that you may access and another that is stored in a safety deposit box.

If your property is stolen, you will be able to provide information about the items taken. For any items that do not have serial numbers such as jewelry, you should take photographs and store them with the form.

You should photograph any item that does not have a serial number and update this list each time you obtain additional items. Review the form annually.
