Keep Your Computer Safe

"Keep your computer safe" was the central theme for David Bartlett's well-received presentation at the April NBPCAAA General Membership Meeting.

David Bartlett, an NBPCAAA member, retired after 31 years with the City of Saint Francis fire department, now devotes full time to his computer consulting business named "Computers Made Easy". He is also actively involved in the community, giving free lessons on computer technology and use at four different locations, including the New Berlin Senior Center. He currently has over 40 different presentations to offer. Some samplings are "How to use the Internet", "Genealogy", and "Digital Cameras".

David was asked to address the issue of identity theft. He answered the call by covering a wide range of cautions and suggestions as to how to stay safe in cyberspace, protecting personal identity and ensuring the health of a computer. Along the way, he mixed in definitions of select technical terms, and suggestions on software programs that can be useful to address troublesome computer issues.



Here are some of the tips he covered in his presentation:

- Don't give personal information over the phone, especially to solicitors promising software and/or computer assistance.
- Your computer is only safe when logged off, otherwise it is exposed by being connected to the internet.

- Protect your IP Address (Internet Protocol Address), and personal information by protecting it with good software (Firewall, Anti-virus, etc.).
- Guard against malware.
- Make sure that you are using a good virus protection program, and use the automatic updates that are available.
- Make sure that your firewalls are active, and use the automatic updates that are available.
- Do not use your name in your email address. It can be used by a hacker to track down your identity.
- Make sure all Microsoft updates are installed as soon as they become available.
- Watch out for phishing.

SWAT exercise

“Come out with your hands up” “Get down” “Don’t move”

On a cold cloudy day in April, members of our county Suburban Critical Incident Team (SCIT) assembled for training to be held in and around an abandoned farm house. NBPCAA members, along with others, played roles in three scenarios involving hostage-takers with guns, evil intent, and multiple hostages. These training events are held periodically during the year to hone SCIT skills and teamwork. They are carefully scripted to reflect real life situations.

The Waukesha County Suburban Critical Incident Team (SCIT) is made up of law enforcement personnel from nine communities. This arrangement ensures an effective incident response team with enough well-trained members with the necessary skills to ensure the successful resolution of the mission.

There are several elements of the team that work together. There are the operational team members who are highly trained and skilled in the use of tactics, weapon systems and specialty

vehicles and equipment. A Crisis Negotiations Team (CNT) is responsible for skillfully communicating and negotiating with barricaded and disturbed subjects. Another element is the Tactical Medic who is a certified medical professional providing immediate medical care to team members, citizens and suspects during an incident. There are also team members who deal with technical and tactical issues and the Canine Unit.

Critical incidents are relatively rare in our community, but they can happen when least expected. In view of that fact, SCIT's training goals are aimed at serving and protecting our community with the best possible preparedness.
