October 2015 General Meeting



On Thursday October 22nd the NBPCAAA was honored to have as speaker Waukesha County Sheriff Eric Severson.

From his biography we learned that he maintains executive oversight of all activities of the office to include sworn operations, jail, work release and administration functions. Sheriff Severson has served the Waukesha Sheriff's Office for over 28 years in supervisory and command positions throughout the department. In addition to patrol command assignments, he has commanded the department's Metropolitan Drug Enforcement Unit, Tactical Enforcement Unit (SWAT), K9 Unit and was the founder and first President of the Wisconsin Law Enforcement Canine Handler Association.

Eric Severson is a past Chairman of the Board of Directors for the Wisconsin High Intensity Drug Trafficking Area (HIDTA). He is a member of the FBI National Academy Association, the Badger State Sheriffs Association, the Wisconsin Sheriffs and Deputy Sheriffs Association, and the National Sheriffs Association.

He was elected to the office of Sheriff approximately 2 years ago.



As Sheriff Severson shared details about his personal and professional dedication to a safe Waukesha County, his family, his personal interest in aviation, all members present fully appreciated both the work of this demanding job but also the man whose job it is.

The Sheriff's primary interest and passion is the safety of the citizens of Waukesha County. To that end he encourages active cooperation with the various law enforcement agencies that operate within the county.

We are truly blessed to have Eric Severson as our sheriff because of both who he is and what he contributes to the life and safety of our county.


As citizens of Waukesha County and members of the NBPCAAA, our thanks and appreciation goes out to Sheriff Severson for his service to our county.

the requirements to carry and how to carry. Also covered was gun safety, how to carry safely, and where you can and cannot carry. Also included were the requirements to use deadly force, and what deadly force is. The legal implications of carrying a concealed weapon. How to obtain, maintain and renew a license.

Emergency Notification

Waukesha County Communications and the New Berlin Emergency Management will be using Alert Sense for weather related or emergency management. The public may register their cell phones and/or email addresses for community notification of both police and fire critical incidents through WCC (Waukesha County Communications):

The Integrated Public Alert and Warning System (IPAWS) is used during an emergency for officials to alert and provide the public with life-saving information quickly. It will save time when time matters most, protecting life and property. The public does not need to sign up for anything to receive an IPAWS alert. IPAWS alerts are broadcast over TV, radio, and cell phone towers.
