Each year's turnout grows as this free-to-the-public event offers so many safety education aspects and family fun events to our community.



Serving Around the World

Dr. Arthur Angove has been in New Berlin since 1966. He has affected individuals, families, communities and organizations during his lifetime in numerous ways. He has impacted New Berlin and the surrounding areas for 50 years. Here are few of his highlights.

Art met his wife, Carmen, through his sister Marilyn. Carmen and Marilyn were best friends. Soon Art and Carmen became best friends and were married. They were inducted into the U.S. Air Force Air Defense Command, Ground Observer Corp in 1953. Art graduated from Westmar College in Le Mars, Iowa. He taught biology, chemistry and physics for three years. He pastored two churches in Iowa for four years. Then he earned his D.O. Degree at Des Moines University College of Osteopathic Medicine in 1958. He did his general surgery residency in Pontiac, Michigan, surgical anatomy at Wayne State University, then he moved to New Berlin in 1966 to be a

general surgeon at the New Berlin Community Hospital/ Memorial Hospital where he became Chief of Surgery from 1968-1988. Dr. Angove transferred to Lakeview Hospital

in Wauwatosa, then to St. Joseph's Hospital in Milwaukee where he currently practices. Carmen passed away in 2002.

Dr. Angove started flying lessons while studying physics in 1957. He put his studies into practice. He started taking medical/surgical teams to Yucatan and Central American countries. As his family grew, he bought a larger plane, a twin engine Cessna 411a which made it possible to take more Medical Missions teams to Yucatan, Honduras, Nicaragua, Belize, Guatemala and Haiti. In 1969 after returning from a medical mission in Bolivia, he cofounded Volunteer Intertribal Medicine to provide medical care for the 11 Wisconsin native tribes and bands.

Art and Carmen have six adult children, 22 grandchildren and 30 great grandchildren. They have had numerous

precious pets over the years. Art's father built a wonderful playground which brought the neighborhood kids to their home. Some of his fondest memories of his children were watching his boys play basketball on their unicycles and watching his girls practice cheerleading outside the kitchen window. They could see themselves in the reflection of the window and he and Carmen could watch them from inside.

Dr. Angove has been on numerous boards and associations as well including: Medical Director for the New Berlin School District; Team Physician for New Berlin West High School; New Berlin School Board clerk; Founding member and Lay Leader at Our Lord's United Methodist Church 1966; Member of the Oakwood Church,

Delafield; Chaplain for American Legion Post #488; Board member of the New Berlin Police Citizens Academy Alumni Association; President of the Rotary Club of New Berlin; Senior Citizens Club; Lifetime member of American Osteopathic Association; American Medical Association; American College of Osteopathic Surgeons; past President of the Wisconsin Association of Osteopathic Physicians and Surgeons; Trustee Emeritus at Des Moines University; Grand Marshal for the 2019 Commencement; Member of the Wisconsin Medical Society, Credentials Committee and Nominating Committee, House of Delegates; Member of the Academic Physicians Section of the AMA, and Senior Physicians Section; American Osteopathic Association House of Delegates; Milwaukee Academy of Medicine; President of the Christian Kako Retreat Center, Russian Mission, Alaska; Medical Missions to Kenya, East Africa, Saipan and Taiwan.
